We resource the wider community and regularly consult a range of stakeholders.

The successful applicants will have working knowledge of Harm Minimisation Policy, the principles of community development and illicit/injecting drug use issues. Qualifications in human services area and/or relevant experience will be highly regarded. Effective communication skills and the ability to maintain a calm and professional manner in an often challenging environment are required.

NRCH provides services to a largely CALD community and experience in working with people from CALD communities and/or having a second community language would be beneficial. Vietnamese language and writing is required for the Vietnamese support worker position.
